





THE THOMAS EVERETT CAPTAIN'S CUP COMPETITION

"A GOLF TOURNAMENT WITHIN A GOLF TOURNAMENT"

The friendly competition between the individual State Police Troops and other qualifying law enforcement agencies wishing to compete for The Captain's Cup during the Annual Association of Retired Delaware State Police Golf Tournament.

Captain Thomas Everett retired from the Delaware State Police in October 1973 and was a very active member of the Delaware State Police Museum Board of Directors. Captain Everett worked tirelessly to make the Museum all that it could be.

Captain Everett not only served on the Board of Directors, but he put in many tireless hours of maintenance at the Museum. Captain Everett was dedicated to make each year's golf tournament a success.

Captain Everett passed away suddenly December 2009, and has been sorely missed by those who knew him as a friend and worked with him on the Museum endeavors. In that vein, we are honoring him with a friendly competition between active police officers at the Annual ARDSP Tournament.

Please consider entering a team of four active police officers from your Troop or Department in this year's tournament. GO FOR THE BRAGGING RIGHTS NOW!

To qualify: A team must consist of four active police or other law enforcement officers from the same DSP Troop, police department, or other law enforcement agency –

DAG's are eligible.

Any law enforcement department or agency that has less than fifty sworn law enforcement officers can combine with another small department or agency to put together a team, provided that the combined manpower of the two agencies does not exceed 75 officers.

The rules for this competition will be the same rules that apply to the regular tournament and the active law enforcement team is eligible to win both the regular tournament and the Captain's Cup competition.

The Captain's Cup will be the property of the ARDSP, with a smaller trophy awarded to the winning team each year to display in their facility. The winning team's agency or Troop will be engraved on the Cup's base each year. The Captain's Cup will be kept on display in the Museum.
